# PREMIUM CLASSES WITH DUAL-ENROLLMENT OPTION

High Country Home Educators is now partnering with Colorado Christian University's CCU Academy to provide Dual Credit class options to our families. Through our dual credit program, students can jumpstart their college degrees without leaving their high school/homeschool campuses. Colorado Christian University is a four-year liberal arts university accredited by the Higher Learning Commission; therefore, our credits transfer to many colleges and universities. CCU Academy desires to support students by offering college credit options taught from a Christian worldview—in keeping with CCU's mission to provide *Christ-centered higher education transforming students to impact the world with grace and truth.* 

These classes are Premium Classes at High Country, and the cost will be \$85 (cash discount) or \$89 (credit) for each class hour, paid to HCEC. Dual Credit will be an additional **optional** add-on and the cost for Dual Credit (DC) is \$200 for 3 college credits from Colorado Christian University. Registration for CCU Dual Credit will take place in January, as the courses are full year courses, two semesters. You will need to register for the DC courses both semesters at High Country in order to receive Dual Credit. You do *not* have to pay for Dual Credit in order to take these Premium classes at High Country. College credit registration is optional. DC Classes are taught by highly qualified High Country faculty, approved by CCU.

Benefits of taking CCU Dual Credit courses:

- Higher GPA in college
- Affordable college credit that transfers nationwide
- Prepares students for rigors of college courses
- Enter college with general education and elective courses completed
- Shortens the time required to complete an undergraduate degree, allowing for the option of pursuing an additional major

# SPECIAL NEEDS ACCOMMODATIONS

#### REGISTRATION

Although there is a 5-class limit per student on the first day of registration, this limit is lifted on the third day of registration with a second appointment.

You can request a second appointment to sign up for additional classes by emailing regschedulecoordinator@hche.org or requesting one at your initial appointment. Second appointments will be Wednesday afternoon.

If you are unable to make the second appointment, we have registration volunteers who can walk your appointment through with a prepaid deposit. Please notify our registration team if you would like a second appointment.

#### High Country Enrichment Classes (HCEC) Welcomes You and Your Family!

We look forward to seeing you around the halls of High Country! Now that you are here, you may be interested in knowing a few specifics about us.

#### When, Where and How!

- Classes meet two days each week, Tuesday and Wednesday, for a 12-week semester. We have two separate semesters Fall and Spring. Enrollment and payment are by semester.
- We enroll students in grades Kindergarten through High School. We also have some classes available to Adults.
- Twice a year we register for classes. You can request a Registration Appointment by logging onto our website at www.hche.org and requesting a registration appointment. See page 43 for specific dates and information about requesting a Registration Appointment.
- All Registration is In-Person only. We meet on the campus of New Life Church in the Tent. Find all of the Registration forms that you
  will need to register on pages 47 and 49.

#### Who's Involved?

Once enrolled for classes, please make plans to attend the New Family and Student Orientation designed just for you to learn your
way around HCEC and meet our teachers, staff and family volunteers. See the Important Calendar Events on page 1 for dates and
times.

#### What's the Cost?

- Class costs are based on a 55-minute class period for the 12-week semester or one semester. Two-semester re-enrollment and payment is required for the second semester. Many classes have additional charges for materials and supplies.
- A \$20 deposit for every class is required at enrollment, with the exception of homework rooms. This is a Non-Refundable Registration Deposit. See page 44 for more information on our financial policies or contact our Finance Department at ECFinance@hche.org.
- You can improve your class options by serving! We offer several levels of service at HCEC including Teacher, Vital Partner, Staff and
  Registration Volunteer that provide families with Registration Priority. This priority improves your Registration Appointment time.
  Our Vital Partner and Ministry Volunteer program furnishes families with an opportunity to offset class costs, as well as serve others.

THIS IS THE FIRST SEMESTER OF A TWO-SEMESTER CLASS. Algebra 1, An Incremental Development, is a two-semester, 2-hours-perweek class, using the Saxon, 3rd Edition text, covering 4 or 5 chapters each week. Concepts to be covered include: algebraic equation manipulations; graphing in 2-dimensions, solving 2 equations with two unknowns via graphing, substitution, and elimination; simplifying terms; polynomial and square root manipulations; factoring trinomials; solving quadratic equations; word problems; absolute value problems; geometric shapes, volumes, and surface areas; Pythagorean theorem, etc. Prior to the first class students must read Chapters 1-10 in the text and do the odd numbered problems in a spiral notebook. THIS IS THE FIRST SEMESTER OF A TWO-SEMESTER CLASS. In a world where "truth" seems to change every five minutes, parents and students alike often have a difficult time knowing what to say and how to say it when entering discussions about "hot button" topics. This class will help students navigate today's tricky cultural assumptions with clarity, confidence, and courage as they examine biblical, practical answers for today's hardest questions. Using fiveminute videos from the Colson Center for Worldview's "What Would You Say?" program, the teacher will guide thoughtful discussion related to difficult questions such as "Is surrogacy just like adoption?" "Doesn't love make a family?" "Isn't abortion health care?" "Is critical race theory biblical?" and "Is gender assigned at birth?" Students will first consider topical questions individually, journaling their own ideas, and then engage in class discussion before and after the class videos. Students will build a collection of notes as well as biblical references throughout the semester as a practical means to equip themselves to apply what they are learning in real world conversations. **Deposit:** The first \$20 of each class is designated as the Non-Refundable Registration Deposit. This payment holds your child's place in class. The Non-Refundable Registration Deposit is per class, per semester.

**Cancelled Classes:** If HCEC cancels a class, you will be offered a replacement for which the \$20 Registration Deposit will apply. If no replacement is found, HCEC will credit you for the \$20 deposit – this applies to classes cancelled by HCEC only.

**Dropped Classes:** If a family drops a class, the Registration Deposit can be used to enroll in another class for that student or another family member. If a family drops a class and does not replace it with another class, they will forfeit the Registration Deposit.

Homework Rooms do not require a Registration Deposit and the cost is \$5.00 for the 12-week semester. A Registration Deposit cannot be rolled over to a Homework Room.

**How is Grade Level determined?** Although many home school families do not emphasize grade levels, our teachers anticipate a certain age group when planning their classes. For this reason, it is important to sign up for classes where the child's age is standard for the grade level required.

Kindergarten: Must be 5 years old by the first day of classes – no exceptions

Grades K-1: Approximate Age is 5 – 7 minimal or no reading skills

Grades 2-3: Approximate Age is 7 – 9 fair reading/writing skills/ follows simple instructions

Grades 4-6: Approximate Age is 9 - 12 good reading/writing skills

Grades 7-12: Approximate Age is 13 - 18 read and write well/ has not graduated from high school.

Adult: Approximate Age is 18 and older has graduated from high school.

Do Not Enroll in Classes

- Each teacher determines class expectations, letter grades or performance evaluations. HCEC keeps no records for classes.
- Classes are designed for enrichment, although parents may choose to give credit for some high school courses. HCEC does not endorse or verify grades given by teachers or credit given by parents.
- Careful consideration has established each class size, grade level and content. Please do not ask the teacher to change these limitations.
- If your student needs a Teacher Exception for age, skill, or prerequisite, please contact the teacher before enrolling and find the Teacher Exception Form at www.hche.org/registration.
- Contact information is listed in the Class Description, listed above.
- A Teacher Exception does not guarantee enrollment.
- If your child has a special need, learning disability, food restriction or allergy, please
  talk to the teacher before enrolling for a class. Not all teachers are able to accommodate special needs. A Teacher Exception Form may be required. Any accommodations for special needs students in the classroom must also be approved by the
  HCEC Administrator.
- Older-Student Policy: If a student is 18 years of age or older AND has graduated from high school, they must register as an independent family. They cannot use their family's priority as their own. They will need to schedule a separate appointment under their own name and establish priority as an independent HCEC family.

### Important Things To Know:

 5-Class Limit - There is a limit of 5 total classes per child during your first appointment. If you would like to register for additional classes, a second appointment for Wednesday afternoon can be requested before registration at <u>regschedulevolunteer@hche.org</u>. Walk-throughs are available with a held deposit.

Additional classes may be added during Open Enrollment starting August 7, 2024 through September 4, 2024.

- **Teachers** If you are teaching more than 5 hours, you may enroll your child during all the hours that you are teaching.
- **Reserved Position** If your student has been placed on a list for a reserved position in a continuing class, you must enroll them in that class during your initial registration or forfeit their reserved position.
- High Demand-Similar (HD-S) classes have restricted enrollment on the first two days of Registration, August 5-August 6th. Additional HD-S classes can be added at Open Enrollment, starting August 7 through September 4, 2024.

## Waitlist Questions and Policy:

When a class reaches full enrollment, you may elect to put your student on a Waitlist. Enrollment from the Waitlist is not guaranteed.

- If you choose to go on a Waitlist, you may not be enrolled in another class at that same time period. You may place your student on up to two waitlists for any hour in which they are not enrolled in another class, up to four waitlists total.
- A Registration Deposit is not required to be placed on a Waitlist; however, once a space opens in the class, the student cannot enroll without the \$20 Registration Deposit. See the Registrar to complete enrollment in a Waitlisted class.
